We wish him well. Lastly, we are in the process of trying to change the bylaws on rentals. You've heard it from me, you should've heard it at your village meetings. Rentals have taken on a new form and the opinion of myself and many site owners, it has to stop if we want to maintain our community and not turn it into a public campground with people coming and going like revolving doors. 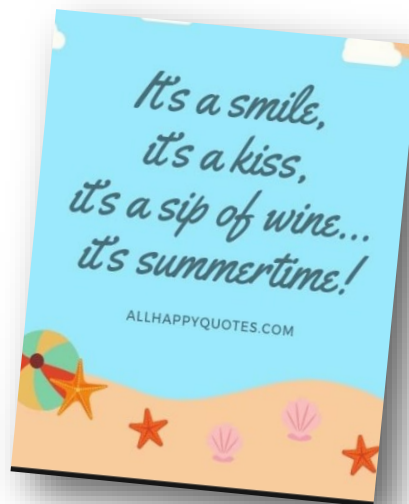

If Septic Experts is unable to access your tank, you will not be pumped out. **Please make sure your septic is accessible for pumping.** No emergency pumping is available. Pump outs are every Tuesday and Friday.

NEW Propane Information



Expired tanks CANNOT be filled! Any tank that is older than 12 years of age (for 2022 that means tanks made before the same month of 2010) is expired and cannot be refilled.

How To Check Your Tank's Expiration

Every tank of propane has a date stamped into the collar along the top of the tank. There are some important numbers and letters here that mark:

- Serial Number
- Water Content (WC)
- Tare Weight (TW)



Manufacturing Date

The date is shown in MM-YY format, so to know if your tank is expired just subtract 12 from the second number. If your stamp is not more recent than the current month 12 years ago, your tank is **expired**.

Other Factors That Might Disqualify A Tank Refill

An expired tank isn't the only reason your tank might not be eligible to be refilled. Propane tanks need to have a device on them called an OPD, or Overfill Protection Device. When a tank is being filled with propane, these devices automatically shut off the valve when the tanks reach a certain capacity. If your tank doesn't have an OPD, we aren't able to fill that tank. Another factor which might cause a tank to be disqualified from being refilled is its general condition. If your tank has visible rust or damage anywhere on it, it could be unsafe to fill it and therefore would be disqualified from receiving a refill.



Recertified Tanks

Tanks that are past their normal expiration date can be re-certified by someone who is trained to do so. If the inspector deems the tank's condition to be usable, they will put a sticker on the tank with an "E" after the manufacturing date. This "E" adds another 5 years to the life of the tank.



Tall Timbers Propane Tanks for Purchase

If you have a tank that has expired, for your convenience Tall Timbers sells new 100# and 20# tanks. We will remove your expired tank and make sure that it is properly disposed of!

Unfortunately, Tall Timbers is also feeling the effects of rising costs. Even our happy place is not immune. New propane pricing is now,

PLEASE BE AWARE, IF YOU PLACE AN ORDER FOR A 100# PROPANE REFILL, AND THE TANK IS NOT EMPTY OR IF IT IS EXPIRED, THERE WILL BE A \$25.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE ASSESSED TO YOUR ACCOUNT. IF YOU PAY WITH A CREDIT CARD, THE 2% FEE CANNOT BE RETURNED

Remember, expired tanks will NOT be filled

Additional Propane Information



We will gladly refill your propane tanks at the Office. We can fill 20#, 30#, 40# and 100# tanks. Please bring your UNEXPIRED tank to the office (with the exception of the 100#'s) and **leave them** on the wall near the propane. After payment is made, you will give you a tag to put on your tank. **Please keep in mind that propane is not filled after 2 pm.** All propane **must** be paid for in advance.

- **100#:'s:** Site owners must disconnect their tanks from the trailer in order for maintenance to pick them up. All propane is pre-pay. Tanks are called in and filled the **next morning**.
- Maintenance is not responsible for disconnecting or connecting propane tanks to trailers. Please note, propane tanks have expiration dates stamped on them; **expired tanks cannot and will not be filled.**
- **A \$25.00 fee will now be charged to site owners if maintenance comes to pick up your tank and the tank is still full, not disconnected or expired.**

Guest Procedures

Guest Procedures: All guests **must** be registered with security (973.875-6060). No guests will be admitted until the guest can verify with you. Guests may not be swiped in with your gate card; violations will be issued. Security can also be given the names of individuals that you do not want access given to!

Parking Passes **MUST be paid for in advance.** Invoicing for parking passes will no longer be offered this season. Passes must be purchased 1/2 hour prior to the office closing. If your guest is going to pay, they must arrive during business hours. Parking passes cost \$10.00 per car and they are valid for one week. Payments can be made at the office PRIOR to your guests arrival or by credit card ONLY. No cash will be taken by security.



GARBAGE & DEBRIS



There are bears in the campgrounds all the time. This is their home. They look for food and have been spotted climbing into our dumpsters and bringing out food garbage bags. We do our best to deter them but these bears have become accustomed to humans. If you put your food garbage in the dumpster instead of the compactor, they will drag it out and make a huge mess. Besides the aesthetics, it can become a health hazard! It also takes our Maintenance Crew away from other important jobs. **ANY KIND OF FOOD GARBAGE MUST GO INTO THE COMPACTOR!!** The bears in our community are wild bears; you should never feed them! If the bears find food in the dumpster, they will continue to go there & make a mess of your campground. Please do your part and put your trash in the right place. **Be considerate!** **Your** Maintenance Department will have to pick up after the bears...and you! Help us keep your Tall Timbers clean!

The dumpster area is located at the Tall Timbers entrance at the side of the Guard House. Please place your garbage in the appropriate containers.

The Compactor – Household garbage ONLY. Place all bags containing food into the compactor to avoid attracting animals. If the compactor is full, please notify the guard on duty.

The Open Tops – Bulk items only. **NO FOOD!** (This will attract the bears!)

Recycle Bin – Paper, plastic, glass and aluminum only. Please be sure to rinse any food out.

Red Dumpster – Scrap metal only. Do not throw old propane tanks in the dumpster, please contact the office for proper disposal methods.

Please dispose of your garbage properly and never feed the wild animals. Animals fed by humans tend to become nuisance animals and/or become dependent on humans for survival. This is their home as well as yours; we need to respect each other. You can do your part to help prevent most problems by just respecting the wildlife laws. By doing our part we can ensure the safety of our site owners and wildlife alike!

If you continue to dump them off the side of the mountain for convenience, the Town will **no longer** come in and treat for mosquitos. We must all do our part in helping reduce the mosquito population.

Toilets Aren't Trash Cans!

Don't flush anything besides human waste and toilet paper. Your septic system is not a trash can.

Never flush:

- Cooking grease or oil
- Feminine hygiene products or Condoms
- Dental floss, Cigarette butts, Coffee grounds
- Cat litter
- Wipes (even the "flushable" ones)
- Paper towels
- Sharps, or sharps containers (needles)
- Household chemicals like gasoline, oil, pesticides, antifreeze, and paint or paint products

When anything other than human waste and toilet paper are flushed, pipes and filters will become clogged causing damage to your septic system components.

Think at the Sink!

Your septic system contains a collection of living organisms that digest and treat household waste. Pouring toxins down your drain can kill these organisms and harm your septic system. Whether you're at the kitchen sink, bathtub, utility sink, or toilet:

- Avoid chemical drain openers for a clogged drain. Instead, use boiling water or a drain snake.
- Never pour cooking oil or grease down the drain or toilet!
- Never pour oil-based paints, solvents, or large volumes of toxic cleaners down the drain or toilet. Even latex paint waste should be minimized.
- Eliminate or limit the use of a garbage disposal, which will significantly reduce the amount of fats, grease, and solids that enter your septic tank and ultimately clog its drainfield.

Get To The Bottom Of It

We are frequently asked, "How Does a Septic System Work?"

A typical septic system consists of a septic tank and a drainfield, or soil absorption field. Below is a brief overview of how septic systems work.

1. All water runs out of your house from one main drainage pipe into a septic tank. This water comes from your sinks, bath tubs, and toilets. In some cases, from your washing machine as well, if you don't have a grey water tank.
2. The septic tank is a buried, water-tight container usually made of concrete, fiberglass, or polyethylene. Its job is to hold the wastewater long enough to allow solids to settle down to the bottom (forming sludge), while the oil and grease floats to the top (as scum). Compartments and a T-shaped outlet prevent the sludge and scum from leaving the tank and travelling into the drainfield area. **
3. The liquid wastewater (effluent) then exits the tank into the drainfield. If the drainfield is overloaded with too much liquid, it will flood, causing sewage to flow to the ground surface or create backups in toilets and sinks.
4. Finally, the wastewater percolates into the soil, naturally removing harmful coliform bacteria, viruses, and nutrients.

** Septic tanks should be pumped on a regular basis to remove the sludge and scum layers (noted in #2 above) and any debris which can cause problems and/or failure of your septic system.

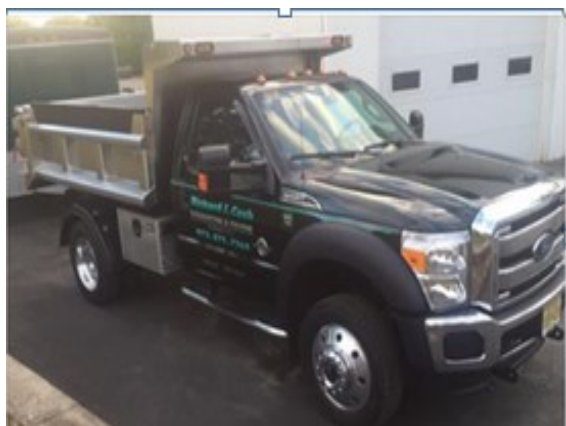
